Driving into Halifax is simple! Whether driving from Atlantic Canada or the rest of Canada you will arrive in Halifax via the Trans-Canada Highway. Also, driving via the ferries from the United States or New Brunswick is an easy trip using our provincial highways.

TAKE TO THE SKY

It's easy to fly to Halifax! Halifax has one international airport, the award-winning Halifax Stanfield located just 30-40 minutes from Downtown Halifax. See page 30 for all the Halifax Stanfield International Airport highlights and need to knows. halifaxstanfield.ca.

RIDE THE RAIL

VIA Rail Canada offers trans-continental connection with Western Canadian cities and some US destinations. It's a great way to see the scenery and back roads of Canada. You can reach Halifax from Montreal by train in less than a day! Learn more at **viarail.ca**.

THE NO FUSS BUS

Maritime Bus provides passenger service across most of Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island, New Brunswick and Quebec that can all connect you to Halifax. For a complete route and schedule visit **maritimebus.com**.

CRUISE INTO HALIFAX

Cruises to Halifax arrive right in the Halifax Harbour where guests are immediately treated to our stunning boardwalk and vibrant downtown core. Halifax is currently a three-seasons cruise port, visiting in late spring, summer and fall. See page 26 for a cruise guest's one-day Halifax stopover guide. Visit **cruisehalifax.ca**.

TIPS ON TRAVELLING TO AND FROM THE AIRPORT

- The MetroX Airport bus is \$3.50 (exact change required) one-way and has three drop-off and pick up locations: Fall River, Downtown Dartmouth and Downtown Halifax.
- The seasonal Halifax Airport Shuttle service is \$22 one way and \$40 return with many drop-off locations and some express options available. Book online or by calling 1-902-429-2029. maritimebus.com/halifax-airport-shuttle.
- Car rentals are available at the Halifax Stanfield and are conveniently located in the lower level of the airport parkade.
- Many taxis and limos are available onsite. To travel from the airport to Downtown Halifax you can expect to pay roughly \$55-\$65.

Note: It takes about 30-40 minutes to get from the airport to Downtown Halifax.



GETTING AROUND

WALK THE STREETS

Downtown Halifax is a walkable city and while there are many hills, it's compact, making it easy to get from one end of the city to the other without issue.

USE YOUR CAR OR RENT

Whether you are renting a car or travelling with your own vehicle, it's easy to get around Halifax. Keep in mind, if you are driving from the airport into Downtown Halifax, you will have to cross one of the Halifax Harbour Bridges, which cost \$1 in cash. If you are renting, we highly recommended our car-rental partner AVIS. Visit them at **avis.ca** for pricing and availability.

USE OUR TRANSIT SYSTEM

If you are unable to walk to your destination, Halifax Transit is another great option. Halifax Transit offers a reliable bus service throughout the Halifax region. Visit their website for fares, schedules, routes and ferry service connecting Downtown Halifax to Dartmouth at **halifax.ca/transportation**.

CALL A CAB OR LIMO

Cabs are readily available in Downtown Halifax and most communities throughout the entire region. Casino Taxi (902.429.6666) and Yellow Cab (902.420.0000) are the largest taxi operators. For limos, we recommend Woods Limousine Service (902.864.8283) and World Class Executive Transportation (902.864.4004).

RIDE YOUR BIKE

Biking is a great way to get around Halifax as we continue to improve our bike lanes each year. Whether you have your own, or are renting from I Heart Bikes (or another bike rental service), it's a great way to see the entire region.

SEASONAL OPTION

To get yourself from Downtown Halifax to other locations across the Halifax harbour such as Downtown Dartmouth and the Bedford Basin, use the **King's Wharf Water Taxi**. Learn more and book at harbourtaxi.ca.

APR 9 - JUNE 2



OCTOBER 19

Nocturne is a fall festival that brings art and energy to the streets of Halifax. From 6 p.m. to midnight, this annual evening of art and wonder transforms the streets of Halifax and Dartmouth into a free, city-wide nighttime art show. Nocturne showcases and celebrates the visual arts scene in Halifax, guiding residents and visitors alike throughout the city to a variety of exhibitions in galleries, local businesses and public spaces.



DECEMBER

Halifax has a BRAND NEW National Lacrosse League team, making it the league's fifth Canadian franchise. The teams start their season towards the end of 2019, playing indoor box lacrosse. Games will take place at the Scotiabank Centre, and include nine regular-season home games, plus pre-season and playoff games.

HALIFAX WATERFRONT HIGHLIGHTS

While the list of places to love in Halifax is certainly long, the waterfront will always be close to the top. In the summer the boardwalk is busy with tourists and locals, and you can't help but feel caught up in the excitement and energy! Here is a short list of highlights to get you started and a map of the top attractions.



VISIT THE HALIFAX SEAPORT FARMERS' MARKET

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Located right on the waterfront with a beautiful rooftop patio, it's no wonder people make a Saturday morning tradition out of heading to the market for breakfast and enjoying the view.



CHECK OUT THE "DRUNKEN LAMPPOSTS"

On the boardwalk it's hard to miss three bendy light posts, known to most as "The Drunken Lampposts". Installed as a temporary display in 2013 after it appeared at Toronto's Nuit Blanche, the displays made a big impression on the city, and have become a permanent fixture on the Halifax waterfront.



EAT ON A PATIO*

In the summer, there is nothing better than a bite and cold beverage on a sunny patio with harbour views. Check out The Bicycle Thief, Gahan House, The Lower Deck and Stone's Throw to get you started.



RENTAL ACTIVITIES*

Along the waterfront you will come across lots of rental and tour companies offering more ways to experience the Halifax waterfront! Try segwaying with Segway Nova Scotia or biking with I Heart Bikes.



LAY ON A HAMMOCK*


The Hammocks on the Halifax boardwalk are a place for passersby to rest and take a great photo, all while enjoying the easy-breezy East Coast lifestyle.

VISIT SEASONAL KIOSKS*

Seasonal kiosks are open between Salter and Sackville streets near Waterfront Warehouse, and are home to roughly a dozen food and activity vendors.

THE FLOATING BOARDWALK*

The Sea Bridge, commonly known as "The Floating

Boardwalk" is a 520-foot floating dock that's open 24/7 (the bridge lights up after dark). It connects the Cable Wharf South Side and the Museum Wharf North (where CSS Acadia is berthed).



VISIT MARITIME MUSEUM OF THE ATLANTIC

As Canada's oldest and largest Maritime museum, the Maritime Museum of the Atlantic brings the sea indoors with its collection of small craft model ships, photographs and relics of Maritime history, including an exhibit on the world-famous Titanic.



NovaScotian Crystal is Canada's only maker of mouthblown, hand-cut crystal. Gather with the crowds at their Glassworks door to watch master craftsmen turn molten crystal into stunning works of art! The Glassworks operates Monday through Friday.*



TAKE A PHOTO IN FRONT OF A MURAL

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A VISIT TO CHARMING FISHERMAN'S COVE AND McCORMACKS BEACH

4 Government Wharf Road, Eastern Passage EASTERN SHORE

Fisherman's Cove is a quaint, restored 200-year-old fishing village offering visitors a peek into the past along with a variety of modern day activities for the whole family. Adjacent to Fisherman's Cove, McCormacks Beach Provincial Park offers an extensive boardwalk that provides coastal walking opportunities and beautiful views. **Bus route:** Take route #60 and get off near Government Wharf Road.

A HIKING ADVENTURE IN DARTMOUTH

54 Locks Road, Dartmouth

DARTMOUTH/COLE HARBOUR

Shubie Park is a 16-hectare urban park located at the head of Lake Micmac in Dartmouth. This heavily forested and dog-friendly park is filled with easily walkable trails, part of the Shubenacadie Canal and has lots of activity rentals such as kayaks and bikes. There is also a full service campground here! **Bus route:** Take the #55 and hop off near Jaybe Drive.

EXPLORE SIR SANDFORD FLEMING PARK AND VISIT THE DINGLE TOWER

Dingle Road, (off Purcells Cove Road) WEST END

Sir Sandford Fleming Park is a short distance from Downtown Halifax. Walk the winding paths and climb the Dingle Tower for stunning views of the Northwest Arm. **TIP:** Visit during the autumn to see striking fall colours from the thousands of surrounding trees.

Bus route: Hop off bus #15 near Fleming Drive, which will get you close enough to walk.

VISIT HALIFAX'S FAMOUS HEART SHAPED POND AND STROLL THROUGH HEMLOCK RAVINE PARK

Kent Avenue, Bedford BEDFORD/SACKVILLE

Located in Bedford lives the famous heart shaped pond in what is now Hemlock Ravine Park. **Fun Fact:** The pond was originally oval, but was reshaped into a heart by Prince Edward's grandson, Prince Arthur, in honour of the love shared between his grandfather and his mistress for over 27 years. **Bus route:** Take Bus Route #80. Get off by Kent Avenue.

TRAVEL TO YORK REDOUBT AND "THE LOOK-OFF"

300 Fergusons Cove Road, Fergusons Cove PEGGY'S COVE COASTAL REGION This National Historic Site offers amazing views of the Halifax harbour, as well as McNabs Island and its lighthouse. It's a great place to "get away" without going far at all. **Bus route:** Ride route #15 to the very end. The bus turns around in the York Redoubt parking lot.

DON'T FORGET THE HARBOUR FERRY!

Hop on the 15-minute harbour ferry from Downtown Halifax to Downtown Dartmouth and enjoy a stunning view as you ride across the harbour for a mere \$2.50. Visit the abundance of top-notch cafés, gourmet restaurants, chic shops, fabulous lunch spots and more in Downtown Dartmouth.

Ferry route: Alderney Ferry accessed at the Halifax Ferry Terminal on the Halifax waterfront.

TIPS

- Most busses are \$2.50. Bring exact cash! If you will only be off the bus for 90 minutes, request a "transfer" so you can ride back to your original destination for free! A transfer is also necessary if you need to take multiple busses to your destination.
- Unsure of where you are going? No problem! All our bus drivers are friendly and willing to answer your questions as you navigate your way around the Halifax region!

OUTDOOR ADVENTURE

Situated on the ocean, covered by forest and filled with lakes, there is no shortage of water-based activities such as boating, surfing, kayaking and paddle boarding in Halifax. We also have spectacular hiking, biking and walking trails inland and along our rugged coastline just waiting to be explored.

TOP 6 HIKES

MUSQUODOBOIT TRAILWAY

90 Park Road, Musquodoboit Harbour, Eastern Shore

The trail begins near the Musquodoboit Railway Museum and is well-groomed and suitable for bikes and strollers. Several looped trails climb up for stunning views of the Musquodoboit River.

KEARNEY LAKE TRAILS

91 Saskatoon Drive, Kearney Lake, Bedford/Sackville Located by the Maskwa Aquatic Club this trail syste

Aquatic Club, this trail system offers diverse terrain and options for any adventurer. This trail is part of the Blue Mountain-Birch Cove Lakes Wilderness Area.

BLUFF WILDERNESS TRAIL

2890 St. Margarets Bay Road, Timberlea, Peggy's Cove Coastal Region The trail offers four loops, totalling over 30 kilometers. Explore wooded areas with many high peaks, allowing for amazing vistas of the surrounding lakes.

CROWBAR LAKE WILDERNESS TRAILS

1800 Myra Road, Porters Lake, Eastern Shore

With over 16 kilometers of wilderness trails arranged in a number of loops, visitors have plenty of opportunities to enjoy the scenic vistas replete with unspoiled wilderness. Don't miss the breathtaking "Crow's Nest" viewpoint.

LONG LAKE PROVINCIAL PARK

799 Highway 3, Peggy's Cove Coastal Region

This park is the perfect city escape. Its great walking trails and pristine lake are perfect for getting outdoors to swim or hike.

POLLY'S COVE

Prospect Road, Peggy's Cove Coastal Region Only a few kilometers long, starting with a welldefined path, you'll enjoy the coastline and views of Peggy's Cove.



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

ART GALLERY OF NOVA SCOTIA

1723 Hollis Street, Downtown Halifax Halifax's Art Gallery of Nova Scotia is the largest art museum in Atlantic Canada. The museum features a permanent collection, with more than 17,000 pieces, as well as temporary exhibitions. While there, be sure to check out the work of beloved Nova Scotia folk artist, Maud Lewis.

1055 Marginal Road, Downtown Halifax Pier 21 is a National Historic Site which was the gateway to Canada for one million immigrants between 1928 and 1971, and a departure point for 500,000 Canadian military personnel during the Second World War. Today, Pier 21 is home to the Canadian Museum of Immigration— Atlantic Canada's only national museum—where visitors explore the immigration experience.

HALIFAX CITADEL NATIONAL HISTORIC SITE

5425 Sackville Street, Downtown Halifax Dive deep into history and culture and visit Halifax's Citadel Hill where you can be a soldier for a day, take a tour of the grounds or simply see any of their current exhibits for yourself.

HALIFAX PUBLIC GARDENS

Spring Garden Road, Downtown Halifax Pass through the stunning castiron gates of the main entrance and enjoy a leisurely stroll through a 16-acre Victorian horticultural masterpiece at the Halifax Public Gardens (a National Historic Site of Canada). It's considered one of the finest surviving examples of a Victorian Garden in North America.

POINT PLEASANT PARK

5530 Point Pleasant Drive, Downtown Halifax During the fall, visitors to this trail are treated to yellows from sugar maple trees and birch trees and reds from the red maple – this park truly comes alive during this season!

SHUBIE PARK


54 Locks Road, Dartmouth

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TRAILS: WALK AND RUN DOWNTOWN DARTMOUTH

MACDONALD BRIDGE

The MacDonald Bridge Walk is a 20-minute walk north from the Alderney Ferry Terminal along Alderney Drive and Wyse Road. The MacDonald Bridge is just over a one kilometer span of the Halifax harbour with incredible views of the harbour and Canada's East Coast Navy.

DARTMOUTH COMMONS

The Dartmouth Common is a 10-minute walk from the Alderney Ferry Terminal, north along Alderney Drive to Leighton Dillman Park. In the park, enjoy the gardens as you ascend the walking path to the gazebo on top of the Commons and enjoy the beautiful views of Halifax harbour.

DARTMOUTH HARBOURWALK

The Dartmouth Harbourwalk Trail traces a 3.8-kilometre path from the Alderney Ferry Terminal to the Woodside Ferry Terminal. Highlights along the trail include: the Shubie Bridge spanning the mouth of the Shubenacadie Canal (a waterway that crosses the province, first used by the Mi'kmaq), the art murals in Dartmouth Cove and views of the Halifax harbour.

HOW TO GET TO PEGGY'S COVE IF YOU DON'T HAVE A VEHICLE!

It's not possible to get to Peggy's Cove by Halifax's public transit system, however, there are plenty of alternative options for those looking to hitch a ride!

RENT A CAR

Depending on how long you'd like to stay in Peggy's Cove, a car rental may be the right fit for you. Halifax is home to all of the major car rental companies such as Avis, and day-long rentals start as low as \$50! Visit avis.ca or 1717 Grafton Street to book.

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TAKE A TOUR BUS

Spend the afternoon taking in all that Peggy's Cove has to offer with an Ambassatours Gray Line Peggy's Cove Bus Tour. Buses depart at 1PM for a 3.5-hour tour from the station located just outside the Maritime Museum of the Atlantic (1675 Lower Water Street) in Downtown Halifax. The cost is \$51.99 a person (based on an adult fare). More at ambassatours.com/historic-tours.

ΤΑΚΕ Α ΤΑΧΙ

A taxi ride to Peggy's Cove will run you \$80–\$100 each way. However, Halifax taxi company Casino Taxi offers Peggy's Cove tours if you're looking for a flexible way to explore the region. A taxi will drive you there, wait for an hour while you explore, and drive you back to the city for a flat rate of \$150. If you want to stay longer, the cost is \$26.80 per extra hour. Call 1-902-429-6666 to book.

FOR THE AMBITIOUS & EXPERIENCED: BIKE

If you're an experienced cyclist with an eye for adventure, consider spending the day cycling to Peggy's Cove. The most traditional route is a 100km loop that will take you through fishing villages, along highways and bike trails. I Heart Bikes Halifax will set you up with a bike and a map so you can pedal to Peggy's Cove on a picturesque adventure that's definitely worth bragging about.


